WILLIAM WALTON was a twentieth-century British composer whose works are characterized by fresh harmonies and rhythmic vitality. His catalog includes orchestral, choral, chamber, and ceremonial music (including the orchestral march *Crown Imperial*, first performed for the coronation of King George VI in 1937), as well as film scores. Of his larger works, he is perhaps best known for his setting of Edith Sitwell’s *Façade* and his mammoth oratorio *Belshazzar’s Feast*.

VISIT FROM ONE OF THE PC(USA) CO-MODERATORS: Westminster will welcome the Rev. Jan Edmiston January 28th and 29th. We will host an informal town hall/potluck supper Saturday evening, and she will preach at both services Sunday morning. She will meet with students at UKirk at the University of Tennessee at lunch on Monday.

Rev. Edmiston attended Andover-Newton Theological School in Newton-Centre, Massachusetts and was ordained to the ministry of Word and Sacrament. She currently serves as Associate Executive Presbyter for Ministry at the Presbytery of Chicago, and was elected Co-Moderator (with the Rev. Denise Anderson) of the 222nd General Assembly in Portland in June of 2016.

Throughout her parish ministry years, she served as moderator of the social justice committee (Albany Presbytery) and personnel committee (National Capital Presbytery), as well as taking leadership roles in the areas of church revitalization, new church development, and presbytery council in both presbyteries.
