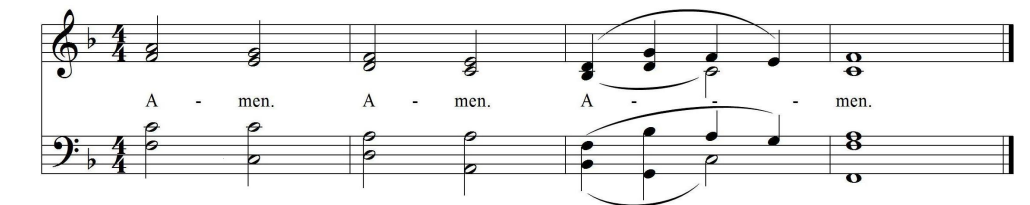

**GIOVANNI PIERLUIGI DA PALESTRINA (c. 1525-1594)** was one of the finest composers of polyphony in the *stile antico*, heard in the dense and intricate counterpoint of this morning’s offertory anthem. Seen as perhaps the last major composer of his era, Palestrina’s form and style would soon give way to the forward-looking *stile moderno* of the early Baroque.

**Katherine Paterson is coming to Westminster!**

Katherine Paterson, one of the most awarded, best-loved American writers, is coming to speak at Westminster on Sunday, April 23 at 2:00.

**In preparation for her visit, we’re kicking off an All-Church Book Study this evening from 5:00-7:30p.m.** We are going to have an intergenerational introduction to Ms. Paterson and her book, *The Great Gilly Hopkins*. We have purchased 25 books to distribute (one per family.) We will enjoy a fried chicken dinner (one of the character's favorite meals), a reader's theater presentation, a movie clip, and other activities to introduce us to the themes of *The Great Gilly Hopkins*. Youth, families of all ages, adults of all ages are invited to join the fun.

Some of Ms. Paterson’s most-celebrated works are *The Bridge To Terabithia* (Newbery winner), *Jacob Have I Loved* (Newbery Winner), and *The Great Gilly Hopkins* (Newbery Honor.) Being Presbyterian is very important to Ms. Paterson. Daughter of Presbyterian missionaries, she grew up in China. She attended King College in Bristol and upon graduation, was a missionary in Japan for 4 years. She married a Presbyterian minister, and began her writing career by writing confirmation curriculum for the PC(USA).

We’re pleased to partner with Maryville College in having Ms. Paterson as our guest.
