Katherine Paterson, one of the most awarded, best-loved American writers, is coming to speak at Westminster on Sunday, April 23 at 2:00.

Some of Ms. Paterson's most-celebrated works are The Bridge To Terabithia (Newbery winner), Jacob Have I Loved (Newbery Winner), and The Great Gilly Hopkins (Newbery Honor.) Being Presbyterian is very important to Ms. Paterson. Daughter of Presbyterian missionaries, she grew up in China. She attended King College in Bristol and upon graduation, was a missionary in Japan for 4 years. She married a Presbyterian minister, and began her writing career by writing confirmation curriculum for the PC(USA).
