The WPC Sanctuary Speaker Series Welcomes Rev. Dr. Anna Carter Florence

Rev. Dr. Anna Carter Florence will speak Saturday evening, February 6 at 7:00 p.m. and at both worship services February 7. She is the Peter Marshall Associate Professor of Preaching at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. She is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and holds degrees from Yale

College and Princeton Theological Seminary (M.Div. and Ph.D.). Her books include *Preaching as Testimony* and *Inscribing the Word*, as well as two forthcoming books: *A' is for Alabaster: A Preacher's Alphabet*, and *Come Back When You've Found Something True: New Ways to Read Scripture*, based on her 2012 Lyman Beecher Lectures on Preaching at Yale Divinity School. She is a frequent teacher and lecturer in this country and abroad. Anna and her husband, the Rev. David Carter Florence, have two grown sons, two dogs, two cats, a flock of chickens, and way too much knitting yarn.
