The music for communion comes from a collection of pieces based on Gregorian chant by the eminent French organist and composer Marcel Dupré, organist at St. Sulpice in Paris.



DUTCH ORGANIST PAUL TEGELS will be heard at Westminster Church **this Friday evening, February 10, at 8:00**, as part of this season’s *Musica Organi* recital series. Dr. Tegels is Associate Professor of Music and University Organist at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington, and a past president of the Westfield Center for Historical Keyboard Studies. His program will feature music by J. S. Bach, Bruna, Buxtehude, and Franz Joseph Haydn, Felix Mendelssohn, and Scheidemann. Cosponsoring this event will be the Knoxville Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. We hope you’ll join us for a delightful evening of fine organ music! A nursery will be provided.
