NOW THE SERVICE BEGINS ******

HEALEY WILLAN (1880-1968) was an Anglo-Canadian organist and composer, writing more than 800 works in nearly every genre, though he is perhaps best known for his sacred music. Born in London, England, he received his training at the Royal College of Organists before emigrating to Canada in 1913. In 1920 he assumed the position of Head of the Theory Department of the Toronto Conservatory of Music. In addition to his duties at the school, Willan became organist and choirmaster at St. Paul's, Bloor Street. In 1921 he was named Precentor of the Church of St. Mary Magdalene in Toronto, a position he would hold until his death. From 1937 to 1950 he was also Professor of Music and University Organist at the University of Toronto.
