DUTCH ORGANIST AND COMPOSER Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck (1562-1621) assumed the post of organist at the Oude Kerk (Old Church) in Amsterdam in 1580, succeeding his father. A most influential teacher, Samuel Scheidt and Heinrich Scheidemann were among his pupils. This morning's prelude lives up to its title-the echoes are contrasting not only in pitch level and dynamic, but also in terms of registration (which stops are pulled). The effect is charming and playful, yet throughout the piece, the organ's beauty, elegance, and essence are allowed to be heard with clarity.
