JOHN GOSS (1800-1880) was an English organist, composer, and teacher. A pupil of Thomas Attwood, organist of St. Paul's, London, Goss eventually held the same position, and along with such composers as Samuel Sebastian Wesley, he attempted to elevate the standards of English church music, which where, during his lifetime, in decline. From 1827 to 1874, he taught harmony at the Royal Academy of Music, where his students included Arthur Sullivan of future Gilbert and Sullivan fame.

SCHILLING GALLERY EXHIBIT: Be sure to take time and look at the new exhibits in the Schilling Gallery. They will be on display through October. David Luttrell's art is on the walls. He describes his work as "digital photographs." He uses found objects and flora from his gardens to make compositions that are then exposed or scanned up to 30 minutes without the benefit of an aperture. Westminster member Patricia Herzog is exhibiting her work in the cases. One case contains her functional, decorative glazed pottery, while the other case contains "alternative fired" small sculptures (Warrior Queens) that have Greek and Mesoamerican influences.
