THE MUSIC OF CHARLES VILLIERS STANFORD is well known to the Westminster congregation and it is always a pleasure for our choirs to sing his inspired and uplifting work. A most important figure among British composers of the late 1800s, he is considered one of the leaders of the musical renaissance in England at that time. Though best known as a prolific composer of Anglican church music and choral services, he was also an influential teacher of many of England's finest twentieth-century choral composers. This morning's anthem is a stirring setting of his beloved hymn tune *Engelberg*, first published in 1904 in *Hymns Ancient and Modern*, now appearing regularly in many hymnals for about the last quarter century.
