NOTES ON THIS MORNING'S MUSIC: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart composed his God Is Our Refuge and Strength at the age of nine(!) while visiting London with his father, dedicating it to the British Museum, which still preserves the original manuscript. The Roger Emerson arrangement of the African-American spiritual Didn't My Lord Deliver Daniel? is a favorite of our young choirs. Its rhythmic drive and syncopations are particularly appealing and engaging for both the choirs and the congregation! The Mendelssohn anthem, composed in 1831, is a lovely, flowing setting of the ancient text paraphrased by Martin Luther.
