WEDNESDAYS WITH WESTMINSTER: On February 20, husband and wife team Jim Harb and Laurel Goodrich, Ph.D. will join us. They took a 17 day trip to Palestine this past July, 2018. The journey began with 10 days in the West Bank town of Ramallah, Jim's father's historical hometown, where they were able to have conversations with Palestinians involved over the years in the Palestinian struggle for freedom, human rights, and independence. They also spent time with Laurel's brother. Born and raised in the U.S., he moved to Israel 20 years ago, eventually marrying an Israeli Jewish woman and obtaining Israeli citizenship. Jim and Laurel made side trips to Jerusalem and Bethlehem, visiting Christian holy sites, and stayed with friends in Nablus, the largest city in the West Bank. A trip highlight was a day-long tour with people who supply the Palestinian olive oil that Jim sells each year at Westminster's Alternative Christmas Market. They will show slides and offer reflections on their journey.
