<u>HARALD ROHLIG</u> was born in Germany and raised there during the years leading up to and including World War II. The son of a United Methodist preacher, he was forced to fight for Germany as an anti-aircraft gunner, while his father was imprisoned at the Bergen Belsen concentration camp for preaching a sermon on obeying God before man. Captured and imprisoned by the Allies, he was released in 1948, at which time he resumed his musical education at Osnabrück Conservatory in Germany and as an exchange student at the Royal Conservatory of Music in London. In 1953 he and his wife emigrated to the United States, where he assumed the post of Minister of Music and Organist at the First United Methodist Church of Linden, Alabama. Two years later he joined the faculty of Huntingdon College in Montgomery, where he remained until his retirement in 2006.
