JOHANN MICHAEL BACH (1648-1694), J. S. Bach's father-in-law and father's cousin, served as an organist and composer in the Thuringian towns of Arnstadt and Gehren. Johann Pezel, a nearly exact contemporary, was a violinist, trumpeter, and composer, living to the east in Leipzig and Bautzen. He is best known for his instrumental music, published in a large number of collections, though he also wrote some sacred choral music and theoretical works. The Brass Choir has played and enjoyed several of his many sonatas and dances, which are staples of the brass literature.
