JOHN DUNSTABLE (c. 1390-1453) was an English composer who played a prominent and influential role in the evolution of music between the late Middle Ages and early Renaissance. His harmonies were based on the comparatively warmer intervals of thirds and sixths than the somewhat starker continental harmonic language. As he was in the service of the Duke of Bedford, Regent of France from 1422 to 1429, Governor of Normandy from 1429 to 1435, and an opponent of Joan of Arc, Dunstable's music reached the continent and influenced leading composers there, such as Guillaume Dufay, Gilles Binchois, and Johannes Ockeghem. Dunstable's approximately 60 works include mass sections, motets, and secular songs, many of which, including this morning's, are in three parts. One interesting sidenote is that according to Dunstable's epitaph, he was not only a composer, but also a mathematician, astronomer, and even astrologer ("he had secret knowledge of the stars")!
