THE OFFERTORY ANTHEM sung this morning is from the Messe de Requiem by the 20th century, French composer and organist Jehan Alain (1911-1940). The work, composed in 1938, existed only in sketches and incomplete choir scores until 1978, when Alain's sister, Marie-Claire, and internationally-known organist and authority on her brother's works, created a composite (complete) score for public use. The Agnus, the third and final movement, is essentially a hypnotic canon between the soprano and bass with the alto and tenor creating a subtle choral "mist" in the middle from which mild dissonances occasionally briefly emerge.

CONCERT ORGANIST JOBY BELL will be heard in recital at Westminster Church this Friday evening, March 6, at 8:00, as part of this season's Musica Organi recital series. performances." As a recording artist, his catalog includes American Classic Widor, a seven-volume series of the complete solo organ works of Charles-Marie Widor, recorded on Aeolian-Skinner and E. M. Skinner instruments around the country. His program will include works by J. S. Bach, Georg Böhm, Johann Niklaus Hanff, and Max Reger, among others.
