THIS MORNING'S MUSIC includes an arrangement of a Nigerian folk song collected by Wendell P. Whalum, the highly acclaimed educator, musicologist, arranger, and director of the Morehouse College Glee Club. Uzee Brown, Jr., Peter Van Eenam's former classmate and friend from music school, has set the melody in four parts making use of ostinati and canon, the latter being somewhat evocative of communities traveling from distant lands back to a homeland where all commune together in peace. The prelude is French composer Olivier Messiaen's first published

work (1928). Though an early composition, it shows characteristics of his mature works, one being his use of his modes of limited transposition. Quoting from Wikipedia as it is concise and accurate: "Despite being only 25 bars long, it takes about 7–8 minutes to perform, due to the extremely slow tempo ("very slow, ecstatic"). The work has two themes: the first, marked "far away, mysterious," is slow and sustained. The second, played by the pedal, but at 4' pitch (drawing a stop one octave above notated pitch) and above, is marked "brief staccato, as a water drop," and represents Christ's blood." Please try to listen with different ears to this musical landscape, much the way one might view paintings from the Impressionists.
