

**OUR THANKS** to Theresa Pepin for leading the Chancel Choir this morning and serving as organist while Peter Van Eenam is on vacation.

THIS MORNING we are treated to two magnificent organ works by Johann Sebastian Bach. The prelude is the first of three settings found in the *Leipzig Chorales* of the Lutheran chorale of 1524, with a text by Martin Luther (a paraphrase of Ambrose of Milan's *Veni redemptor gentium*) and a melody dating from 1174 based its chant. The postlude comes from Bach's masterful compilation of chorale settings for the German liturgy—the *Clavierübung*, Part III. For each element of the service he offers both a large setting (including pedal) and a smaller one for hands alone. This morning's is the larger and it is *glorious!*
