THE BIRTH CANDLE is lit today in celebration of Brooks Henderson Beeler. Born on December 19 to parents Jaclyn and Katherine Beeler and siblings, Sirah, Bentley and Mckenzie.

THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE is a setting of the Christmas chorale in which Buxtehude presents the melody in a highly ornmented version in the soprano line. One somewhat unusual aspect of the text of this chorale is that each stanza ends with *Kyrieleis,* represented in the final four notes of the chorale. Another interesting possibility is the fact that the florid ornmentation of the melody explores quite a wide range. When played with the Sesquialtera II stop on the organ, as it is this morning, we get to hear the vivid and compelling colors of that stop in the *low* range, very North German!
