

DAVID N. JOHNSON (1922-1987), American organist, composer, and educator, studied organ and composition at the Curtis Institute of Music, Trinity University, and Syracuse University. From 1960–1967, he was college organist and organ instructor at St. Olaf College before returning to Syracuse University, where he succeeded Arthur Poister as professor of music and university organist. In 1969, he joined the faculty at Arizona State University, where in 1981, he would be succeeded by Robert Clark, Peter Van Eenam’s organ professor and Westminster’s organ project consultant.

WE WELCOME REV. DR. JEFFERSON K. AIKEN JR., to our pulpit this morning. Jeff, senior pastor emeritus of First Presbyterian Church of Allentown, PA, has degrees from LSU, Columbia and McCormick seminaries. He has served the denomination at the presbytery, synod and national levels. He is a former chair of the Board of Pensions of the PCUSA, and for 20 years he was extensively involved in healthcare, chairing the board of a major health network in Pennsylvania. Jeff and his wife Libby reside in Asheville, NC. Their son, Stephen, wife Jennifer and family live in Knoxville and worship here at Westminster.
