

DAVID HOGAN (1949-1996), was a gifted choral composer and teacher, mentoring a number of students who would go on to national prominence. His music is always finely crafted and full of color, harmonic interest, and beauty. He was one of the two composers commissioned to create new works for the Consecration of the Washington National Cathedral in 1989. On July 17, 1996, Mr. Hogan died tragically as one of the 230 people who lost their lives aboard the ill-fated TWA Flight 800 bound from New York to Paris.
