
\*CALL TO CONFESSION



THIS MORNING'S ORGAN AND CHORAL WORKS are by American composers. Ned Rorem's *A Quaker Reader*, written in 1976, is comprised of eleven movements, each, to quote Rorem, "headed with an epigraph from Friends' writings, many of which, in their urge toward pacifism as solution, extol absolute quiet and absolute light. The music represents a blaze of silence." His *Views from the Oldest House*, written in 1981, was commissioned by the American Guild of Organists for its 1982 national convention. This collection of six pieces is inspired by and depicts various elements seen in the southwest vista from the Oldest House, situated on Nantucket's Sunset Hill. William Brice, Westminster's first organist and choir director (combined), is largely responsible for charting Westminster's musical course in its early days, a path we continue to travel, cultivate, and expand on to present day. This morning's postlude is by William Selby (1738-1798), organist of King's Chapel, Boston.
