

RICHARD FARRANT (c. 1530-1580) was a composer of church music, choirmaster, playwright, and theatrical producer noted for creating the Blackfriars Theatre, which hosted children's companies. Becoming a gentleman of the Chapel Royal during the reign of Edward VI, he resigned the post in 1564 on being appointed master of the children at St. George's Chapel, Windsor. He became Master of the Chapel Royal in 1569, holding this post concurrently with that at Windsor.

NEW ART IN THE SCHILLING GALLERY Please take a moment and enjoy! Mike Berry's exhibit focuses on the beautiful and poetic places in and around East Tennessee. Both landscapes and cityscapes are represented. He uses his own personal language of color and composition to create unique works that also capture his imagination. He received his MFA from the Savannah College of Art and Design in 1997. Knoxville has been the main subject of his work for more than two decades.

Linda Sullivan's pottery is displayed in the cases. She has a Bachelor of Arts in Art and Math from the University of Evansville (Indiana) and a Master of Fine Arts from Northern Illinois University where she focused on glaze chemistry and glaze testing. Her functional pottery has evolved to include interpretations of landscapes through the glazing process. All her glazes are self developed and poured to overlap one after another in a painterly way. She especially draws inspiration from the landscapes of the Southwest.
