FELIX MENDELSSOHN lived and worked in Middle Germany. Both he and J. S. Bach finished their careers in Leipzig and it was Mendelssohn, in fact, who was a critical figure in beginning the revival of Bach's music around 1829. The famous Gewandhaus Orchestra, with its early roots tied to Bach's Collegium Musicum (an orchestra comprised of musically active university students which frequently performed at Zimmermann's coffeehouse), was led and further developed by Mendelssohn, who helped to initiate its great reputation.
