

EDGAR BAINTON, born in London in 1880, studied with such luminaries as C. V. Stanford, Walford Davies, and Charles Wood, and went on to contribute extensively to the English musical renaissance begun by such composers as Samuel Sebastian Wesley. In 1901 Bainton was appointed professor of piano and

composition at the Newcastle Conservatoire, of which he became the principal in 1912. After more than 30 years there, he became director of the Sydney Conservatorium, a post he held from 1934 to 1946. Best known for this morning's anthem, his works include symphonies, symphonic poems, chamber music, choral works, and an opera.
