SERVICE OF CANDLE LIGHTING...

After the scripture is read, the lights will be dimmed, and the minister will light a candle from the Christ Candle. The minister will then light the candles of the ushers, who will then light the candles of the first person on each aisle. Light will then be passed from worshiper to worshiper. Remember that the lighted candle remains upright and the unlighted candle is tipped to the lighted candle.

*HYMN Silent Night, Holy Night

(The candle is held close to the chest) Silent night, holy night! All is calm, all is bright, Round yon virgin mother and child! Holy infant, so tender and mild. Sleep in heavenly peace, sleep in heavenly peace.

(The candle is extended upward) Silent night, holy night! Son of God, love's pure light. Radiant beams from Thy holy face. With the dawn of redeeming grace Jesus, Lord, at Thy birth, Jesus, Lord, at Thy Birth.

Following the singing of Silent Night, Holy Night, the ushers will lead a silent recessional to carry the light outside to the courtyard, weather permitting. The front of the congregation will go out the side door by the pulpit. The back of the congregation will go out through the Schilling Gallery. After everyone has gathered, we will sing the first verse of "Angels We Have Heard on High"
