
*PRAYER OF CONFESSION (Unison)



DUTCH ORGANIST AND COMPOSER Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck studied with Gioseffo Zarlino in Venice and succeeded his father as organist of the Oude Kerk (Old Church) in Amsterdam in 1580. An influential teacher, Samuel Scheidt and Heinrich Scheidemann were among his pupils. This morning's motet is in five parts (five different vocal lines) and it exhibits Sweelinck's mastery of counterpoint. Of particular interest are the two instances of colorful harmonic inflection when he is setting "Emmanuel" and the intense "blooming" of alleluias at the end.



MUSICA ORGANI will present concert organist Alcee Chriss III in recital Friday evening, March 1, at 8:00pm (rescheduled from February 3, 2023). First prize and Bach prize at the Canadian International Organ Competition and the Firmin Swinnen silver medal at the Longwood Gardens International Organ Competition, Dr. Chriss is a composer, conductor, and jazz pianist.
