HIS MORNING'S MUSIC FOR HANDBELLS is a well-known hymn tune arranged for handbells four-in-hand, a technique involving each ringer playing two bells in each hand. The clapper of a handbell strikes the bell along an axis and is set to ring more easily in one direction along that axis (the arm motion will then be in the forward direction). The second bell in a hand is turned so that its axis is $90^{\circ}$ from the axis of the other bell. This allows the player to ring forward with one and "inward" (done with the wrist) with the other, thereby allowing each bell to sound independently.
