**OUR THANKS** to Bob Adamcik for his enrichment of our worship this morning as he accompanies the Chancel Choir, which offers a reprise of the Harry Belafonte song sung this past Pentecost Sunday at the 11:00 service, hopefully allowing the choir to share it with those who were attending the 9:00 service that morning. A special thanks to Bettie Mason for providing the following notes on this song: "Turn the World Around," originally released in 1977, achieved enduring fame from Harry Belafonte's performance on "The Muppet Show" in 1979.

As an admirer of Jim Henson's work, Belafonte had been delighted to accept when invited to be a guest on the show. Viewing it as "an opportunity to do something very worthwhile," something educational, he proposed to Henson that the show "take a look at the lore and history of other worlds, other places," especially the Third World.

Before his performance, he explained how the song came to be. Visiting a small village in the interior of Guinea, he found a story-teller who "went way back into African tradition-into African mythology. He began to tell a story about the fire—which means the Sun—about the water, about the Earth. And he pointed out that all of these things put together turn the world around. And that all of us are here for a very, very short time. And in that time that we are here, there really isn't any difference in any of us IF we take time out to understand each other. And the question is, Do I know who you are? Do you know who I am? Do we care about each other? Because, if we do, together we can turn the world around."

The key here, the answer to these questions, is the pronoun "we," the very first word of Belafonte's song: "We come from the fire." In living our lives, there should be no "us" and no "them" – instead, it should be the collective "we" embracing a shared humanity.
