MUSIC PROGRAM NOTE I was a very young, know-it-all musician in the New York of the late sixties when I got a good lesson in what the word Prelude could mean. A friend snuck me into a darkened concert hall in Harlem to hear Duke Ellington prepare himself for a concert. He played quietly on a piano a composition originally written by his long time friend and music collaborator Billy Strayhorn, who had died not long before. For the remainder of his long career Ellington played some variation of Lotus to himself before every concert. His widow asked that Alec Wyton adapt and play it on organ before Ellington's funeral at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine. Lucky me-Wyton was one of my teachers and passed on his adaptation to me and other students. I pass my version on to you. Today we might call this "centering" prayer but it is what musicians have done for thousands of years. -Theresa Pepin
