All: God of power, give us courage to share our gifts of speech to comfort, uphold and strengthen. Let us be a glimpse of your love to those in need.


One: God of love, in the silence of our hearts give us words of welcome, acceptance and renewal so that when we speak our words come from you. (Silence)
