JUSTICE KNOX NEWS Listening Sessions on September 15th and 22nd right after the 11 o'clock worship service. This is a time for existing team members, supporters, and visitors to gather and listen to each other's concerns about community problems and issues that keep participants up at night. In the past, JK has dealt effectively with problems such as homelessness, affordable housing, mental health, education, gun violence, and inequitable transportation opportunities. Both meetings will be held at Westminster and are open to everyone.

WHITE CHRISTIAN NATIONALISM AND US (Tuesdays at 12p, Sept. 24-Oct. 29): White Christian Nationalism is neither Christian nor patriotic, but in recent years, churches and religious leaders have utilized this distortion of the faith to promote violence in the name of Christ. In this class, we will discuss what White Christian Nationalism is, how mainline churches such as our own are involved in its promotion, and what we are called to do in response.

Our class will begin with a viewing of the documentary, "God and Country" (2024) from 12-2p on Sept. 24 in the McKinnon Room. We will follow that in the ensuing weeks with a book study of The Flag and the Cross: White Christian Nationalism and the Threat to American Democracy by Philip Gorski and Samuel Perry.
