
*CALL TO CONFESSION

MUSICAL NOTE Originally written for solos, choir and organ, Dvořák wrote the mass largely at his summer residence in Vysoká, surrounded by the natural scenery he loved so much and, despite the fact that he had been commissioned to write it, he worked above all for his own enjoyment. This fact is echoed in the work's simple intimacy, fervour and sincerity, without any trace of ostentation. The mass is pure Dvořák: it clearly reflects the composer's humble faith, his natural humility in the face of a higher Order, and his true joy of life. The Mass in D major is one of the most eloquent testimonies of Dvořák's relationship to humankind, to God and to nature.

The universal flexibility and appeal of this Mass is evident in the various arrangements that can be found from orchestral to this brass quartet. It is commonly performed as soprano, alto, tenor, bass (SATB) with organ.

MUSICAL NOTE Craig Courtney, pianist, cellist, vocal coach, accompanist, choral director, clinician, and prolific composer was trained at University of Cincinnati. Further studies were in Italy, and in Austria where he served for a time as faculty at the Mozarteum in Salzburg. Today's anthem is part of his song cycle, "Three Sacred Canticles" in which each is based on a biblical passage referring to singing. May this intimate, calming setting of the Zephaniah passage assure you of God's presence. Listen carefully. You may even "hear" that presence at the end of the anthem.


