

MUSIC NOTES

Set Me as a Seal: Rene Clausen was conductor of the Concordia College Choir in Minnesota for 34 years. At a time of deep personal tragedy, he was led to Song of Solomon: 8:6: *I just sat down and wrote the piece. I don't know what is wrapped up inside these few simple notes. I am struck by the phrase "for love is strong as death," because my actual feeling was just that. Abiding, all-encompassing love absorbs even the pain of death... the simple but powerful conviction of permanent love that seeks to overflow the boundary between life and death.*

The Unclouded Day: Inspired by a vision in the night sky while riding home on horseback, Josiah K. Alwood, a circuit rider preacher ordained by the United Brethren of Christ, penned both tune and text of this gospel hymn in 1879. He describes a "rainbow at midnight and song with morning which filled him with sweet melody."
